NARRATIVE:

July 26th, 2020 at approximately 4:00pm (central time):

The 1979 Dodge Pickup was traveling eastbound on the Interstate 94 Grant Marsh Bridge between Mandan and Bismarck. The Dodge stalled and came to a stop on the eastbound bridge deck. The 2018 Chevrolet Impala was traveling eastbound on the Grant Marsh Bridge and slowed behind the Dodge to change lanes and drive around the Dodge. The 2009 Ford F-150 was traveling eastbound on the Grant Marsh Bridge behind the Chevrolet. The Ford rearended the Chevrolet which in turn rear-ended the Dodge. The vehicles came to rest blocking the eastbound roadway. The vehicle occupants were transported by ambulance to Sanford Hospital in Bismarck.

Eastbound I-94 traffic was diverted onto Bismarck Expressway for approximately 1 hour until the scene was cleared.

This crash remains under investigation by the North Dakota Highway Patrol.
