## **INJURY CRASH NEAR ANAMOOSE**

## **NARRATIVE:**

On 6/5/2022 at approximately 12:45 am, a severe injury crash between a semi and a pickup happened near Anamoose. The semi was traveling east on US-52 from Columbus, ND headed to Carrington, ND. As it approached the intersection of ND-14, near Anamoose, a pickup driving north on ND-14 failed to stop or yield at a stop sign. The driver of the semi swerved to avoid a collision but struck the left side of the pickup near the driver's door hinge. The driver of the semi reported his cruise control was set at 65 miles per hour at the time of the crash with no time to brake. The impact pushed the pickup into the ditch to the southeast of the intersection. Neither occupant in the pickup was wearing a seat belt and both were ejected. The semi sustained disabling damage to the front right, causing it to drive to the right, into a slough, and submerged to the bottom of the windows.

The driver of the semi was not injured. The occupants of the pickup were transported to St. Aloisius Hospital in Harvey. From there they were airlifted to Minot Trinity Hospital. Both occupants of the pickup are in stable but critical condition.

Highway 52 was closed from mile marker 145 to 154 for about 6 ½ hours. Traffic was rerouted during the closure. ND-52 is currently open.

This crash is under investigation by the Highway Patrol.
